Introduction

What is Surrealism? What is Juxtaposition? This is a Digital Art assignment, consisting of multiple layers and Photoshop edits. You will create an original *surrealism* composition combining original images. What story are you trying to tell through your artwork? You can take new images or use ANY past personal images...the more interesting & exotic, the better! Downloading brushes from site like Brusheezy is also an option. Consider using the backdrops to help capture images of your subject matter with a simple background for easier editing.

Space – show a limited depth of field or show a deep depth of field with an interesting foreground, middle ground, and background.

Variety – vary the size and shape of subject matter.

**This project will challenge and improve your Photoshop skills! Give yourself a couple weeks to work on this Digital artwork.

Learning Targets:
